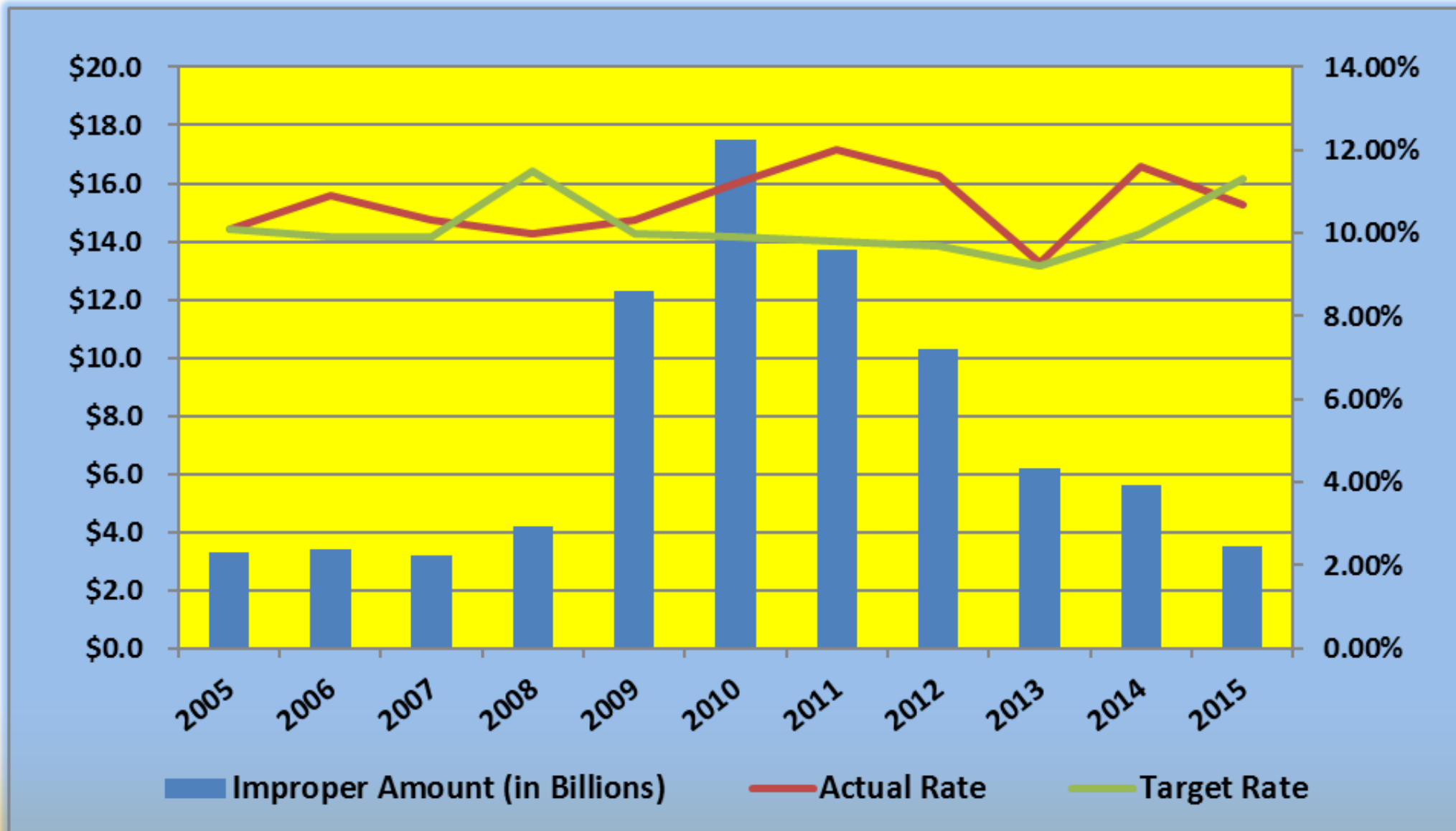

- Develop an Integrity Improvement Investment (III) process to solicit and fund short time Integrity Improvement sub-contracts.
- Develop and fund a UI Integrity Training Academy that would:
 - ✓ Implement a research and training component for state Benefit Payment Control staff,
 - ✓ Implement a research and training academy for state data analysts,
- Host a National UI Integrity Vendors Conference
- Design & build a secure portal, acquire access to data to create a UI “Do Not Pay” analogue portal.
- Develop a model BPC Operation Plan
- Identify and engage a cadre of UI Integrity SMEs on call to assist states with BPC/Integrity efforts.

The Center Going Forward

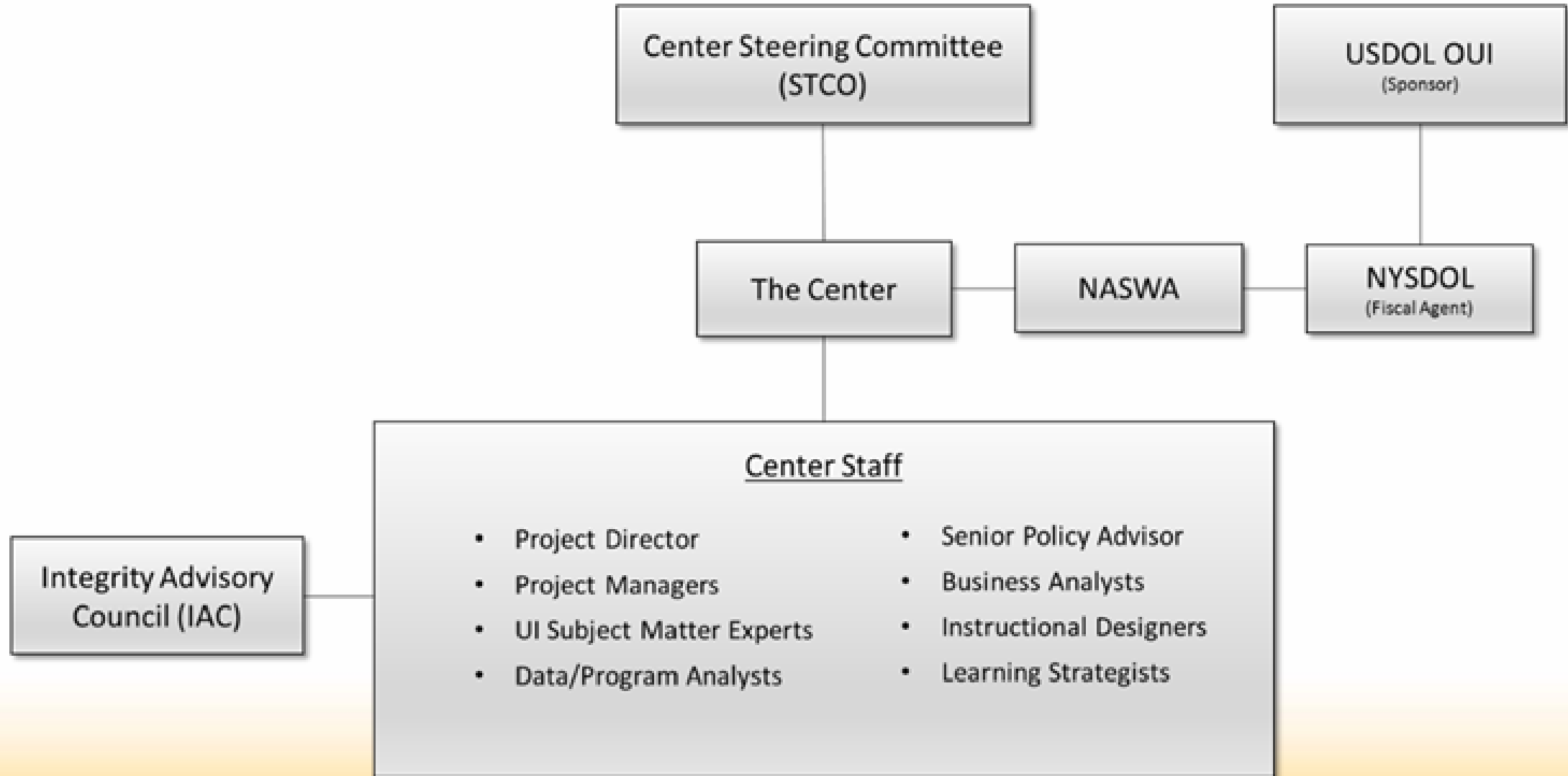
USDOL signed a new Cooperative Agreement with NYSDOL.
There are significant changes in the structure and responsibility for NASWA, NYSDOL and USDOL in the new agreement.

NASWA Signed a new Contract with NYSDOL in December 2015

Key provisions include:

- Restructured the Integrity Center, NASWA is the lead organization responsible for the operation of the Center.
- Center operated by NASWA Management Team and Project Director.
- NASWA modified Steering Committee Charter to provide for an expanded number of member states and to revise the terms and requirements.

Center Organizational Structure

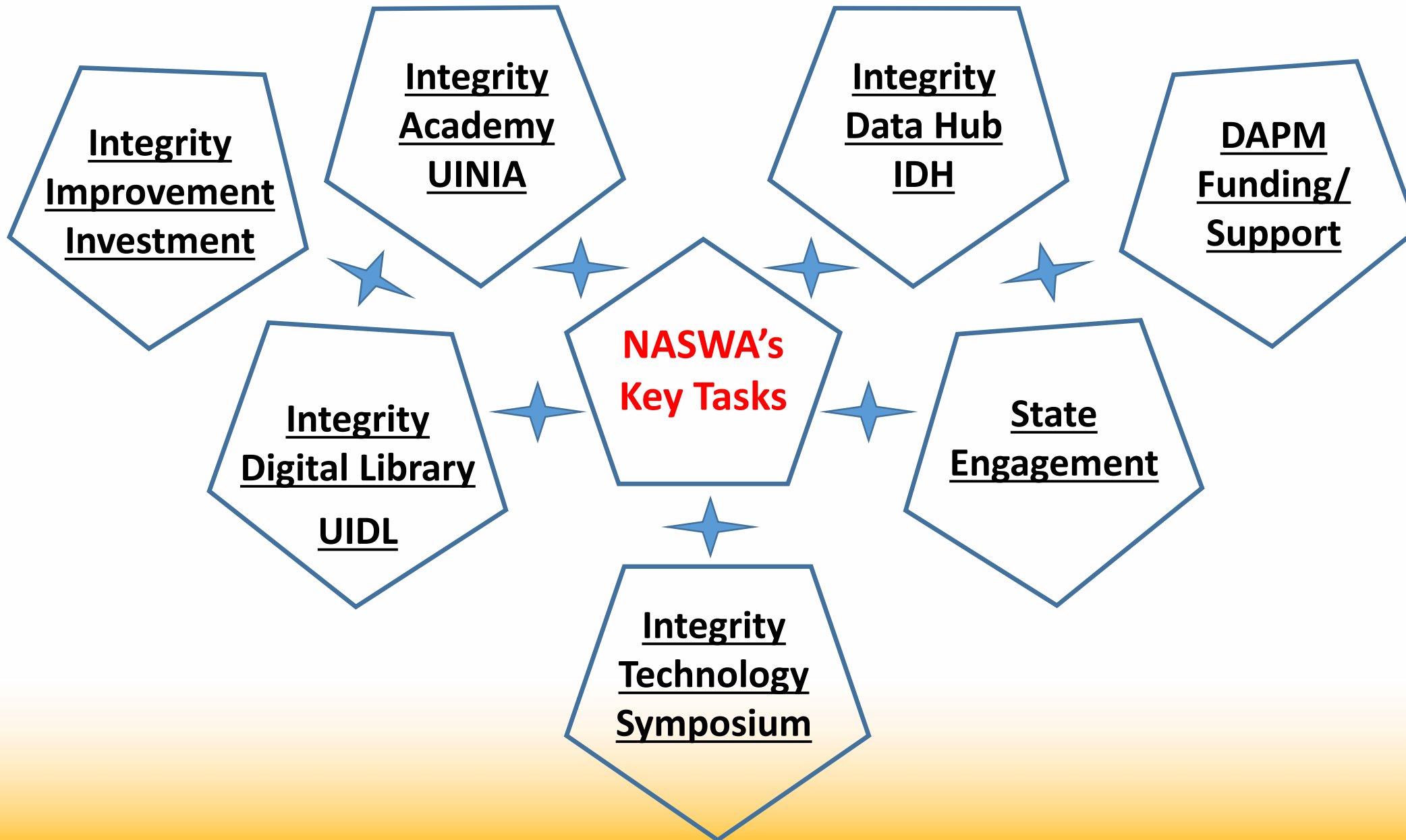

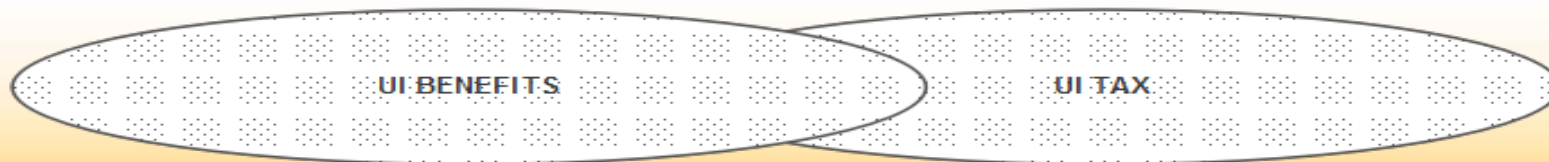
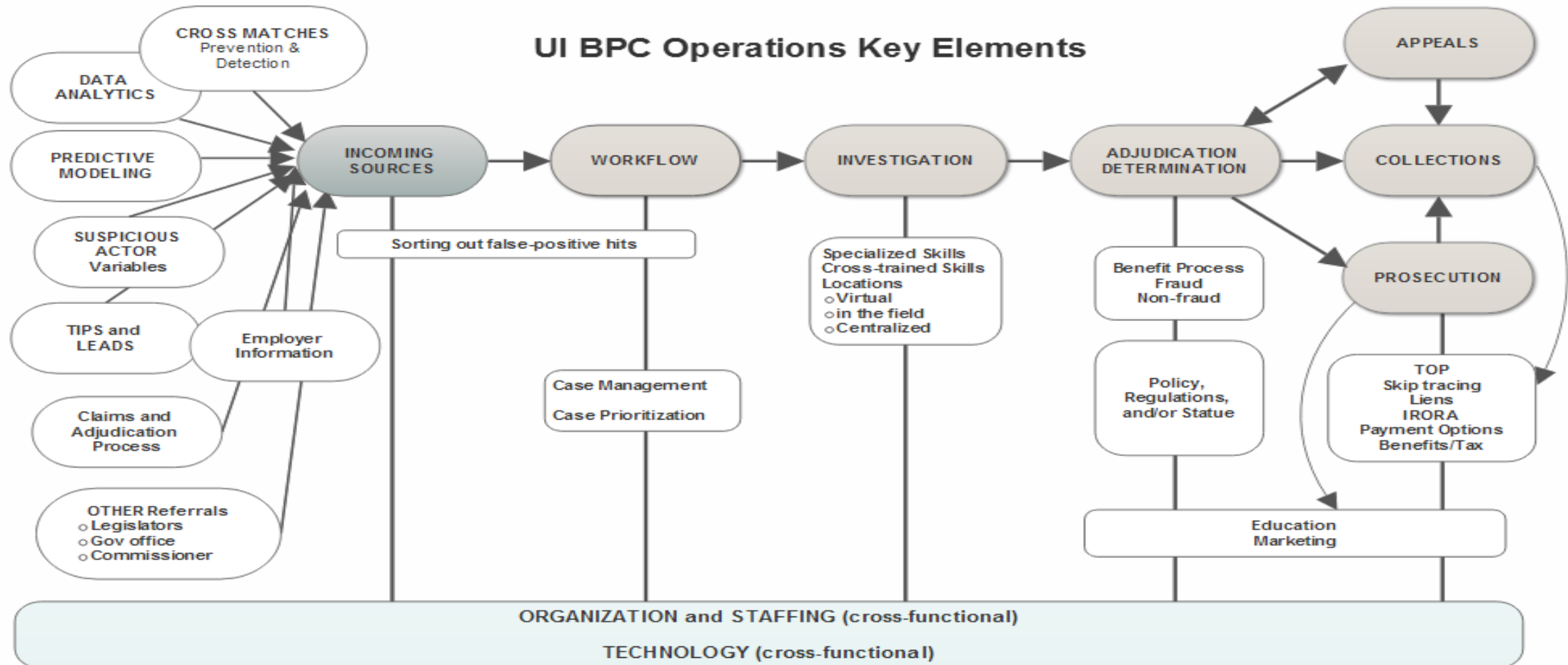
Utilizing State Information

Create comprehensive set of information on state operations & practices

Make this extensive information set available to a variety of state leaders (UI Directors, Operations Executives, etc.) to enable them to:

- Easily find information on promising practices
- Explore other state operations
- Look at integrity practices from a broad overview perspective
- Enable drill down to specific practices/topic areas of most relevance to them

Integrity Investment Funding

OBJECTIVE: Support states by providing funding to pilot tools, strategies and/or innovative initiatives to prevent improper payments

STRATEGY:

- Establish advisory subcommittee
- Minimize administrative burden on states
- Engage key stakeholders to evaluate applications

IFF Projects Funded

State	Amount	Summary of Project
Alabama	\$250,000	To utilize the technology and data source, Accurint and Investigative tools by LexisNexis, to provide data analytics and predictive modeling.
California	\$250,000	To integrate link analysis capability to existing Pondera Fraud Detection as a Service (FDaaS) platform to assist in finding links between claimants, fictitious business operations and clusters.
Florida	\$250,000	To make additional improvements in the Florida Reemployment Assistance Fraud Intelligence Rating and Rules Engine (FIRRE) that will help prevent and detect identity theft.
Georgia	\$250,000	To implement Georgia Unemployment Alert/Ready/Defend Against Fraud Initiative -- a 3-pronged effort to reduce fraud for claimants, business and staff by creating two 3-minute videos for claimants and business, along with a self-directed, multi-media fraud awareness training for workforce staff.
Indiana	\$61,500	To implement an online job search training and engagement system that includes job search requirements that are 100% certifiable and trackable in real time.
New Mexico	\$250,000	To expand the Improper Payment Prevention Initiative (IPPI) to include analytics on employers and design an Integrity Data Mart to store consolidated claimant, employer data and extracts from other state agencies in order to support risk calculation scores.
North Carolina	\$140,000	To conduct a 3-pronged integrity project that focuses on the prevention of internal fraud by providing ACFE membership & certification to 7 auditing staff and purchasing ACL Analytics Exchange to reduce claimant and employer fraud, and enhance cross-matching efforts.
Texas	\$250,000	To enhance the Identity Theft FraudX algorithm by adding data associated with any post initial claim contact by a filer to detect and prevent ID theft related fraud on continued claims, in addition to initial claims.

UI Digital Library for Integrity (UIDL)

The UIDL will be a managed collection of UI integrity information available online to state and Federal UI programs.

The UIDL will provide states with access to comprehensive materials to help states:

- Prevent and detect improper payments and fraud, and
- Recover any improper payments made within their UI programs.

Integrity Data Hub

OBJECTIVE:

Design and build a single hub with interfaces to multiple databases for purposes of cross-matching and data retrieval.

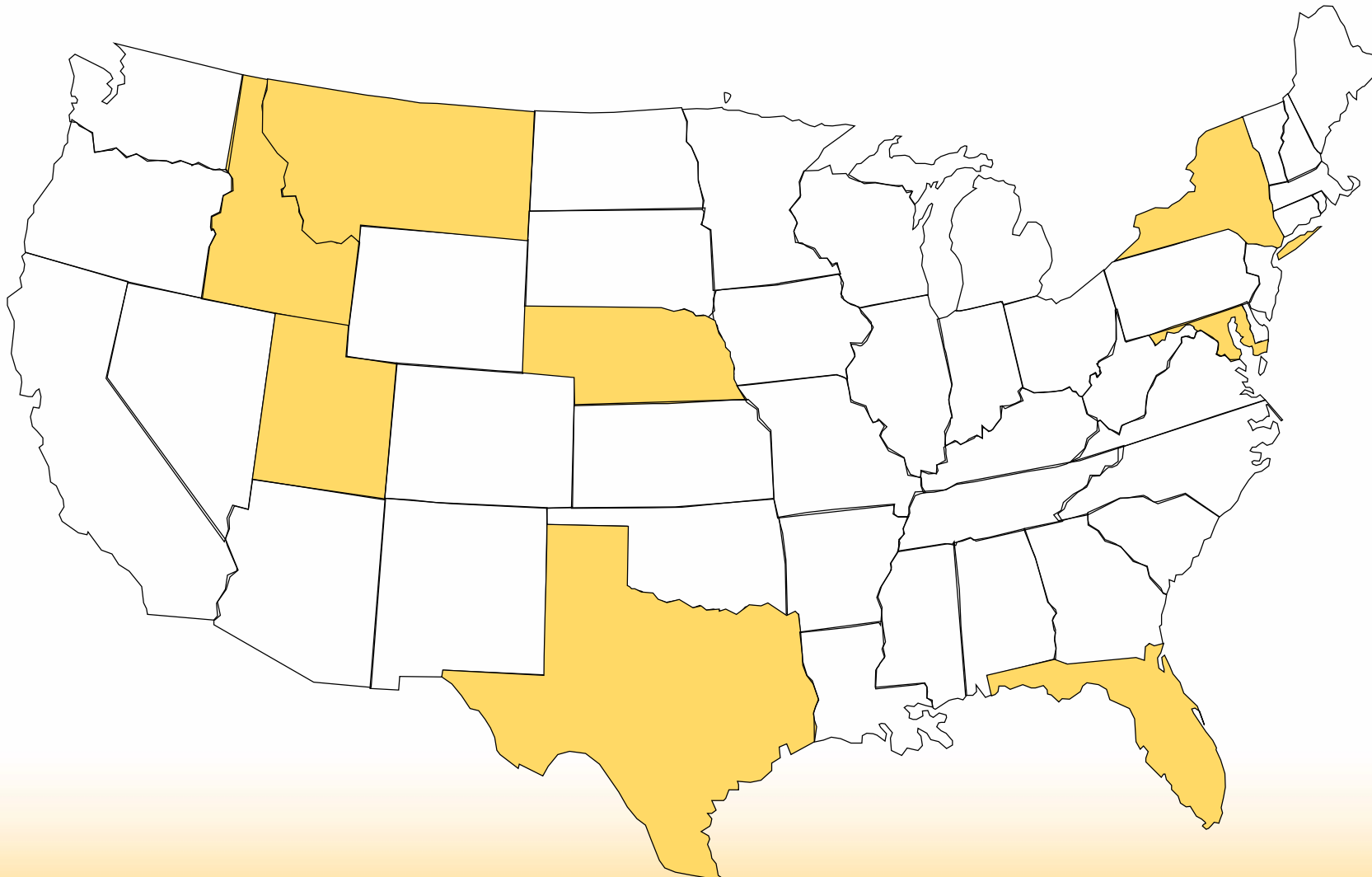
STRATEGY:

- Identify and document available data sources
- Establish pilot projects to evaluate design alternatives
- Establish and validate data collection mechanism
- Develop data sharing agreements

Suspicious Actor Repository (SAR)

- The SAR is envisioned to collect “suspicious actor” information from participating states and aggregate this information in a master file.
- The SAR would then compare initial and continued claims against suspicious actor data and identify matches so states can conduct further investigation as appropriate
- Users would have the option to query the system to determine if any of the selected data elements from one of their claims matches information in the SAR.
- The SAR will serve as the IDH foundation, which will provide interfaces to additional databases for cross-matching & support expanded data analysis and analytics.

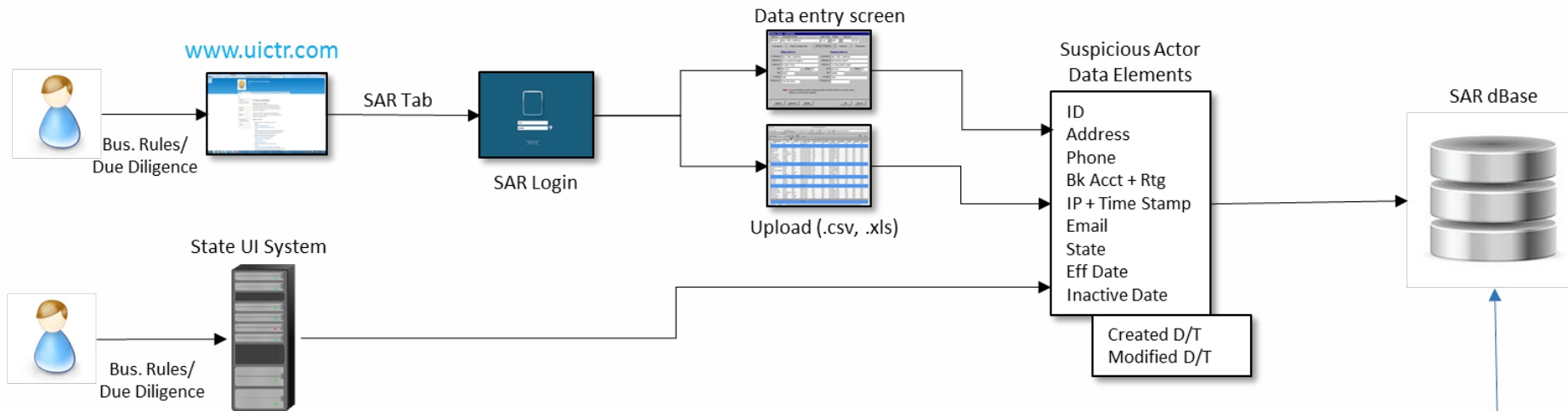
SAR Pilot States



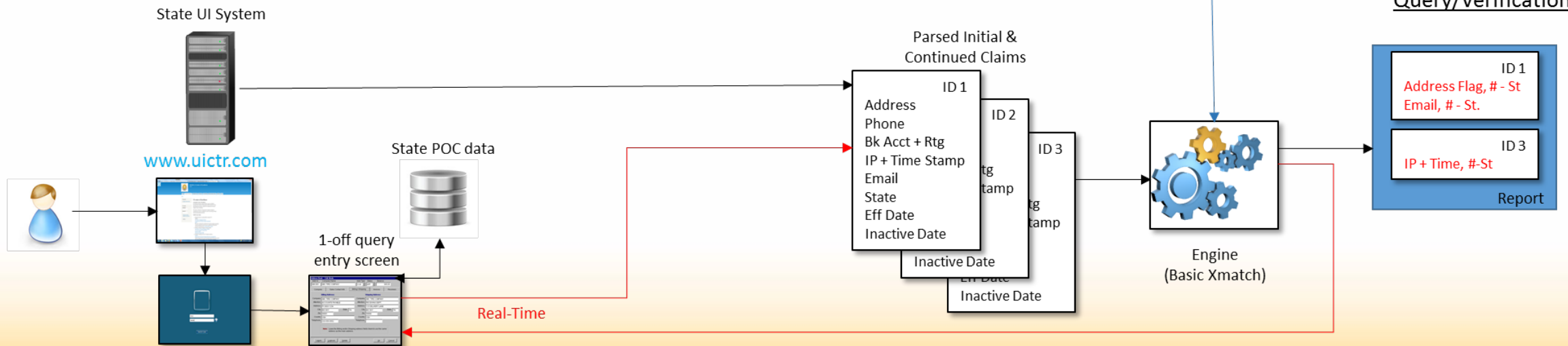

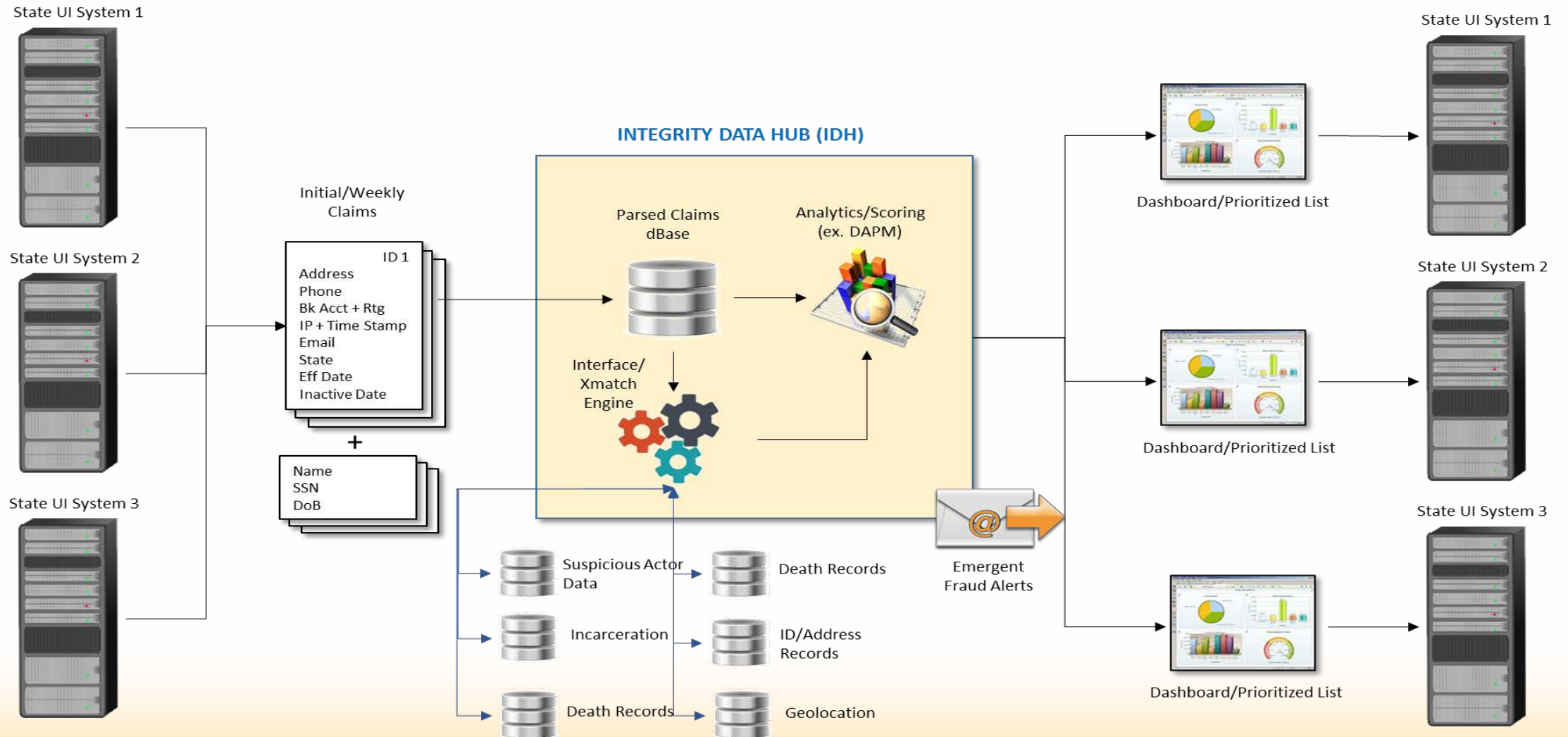
Suspicious Actor Data Collection

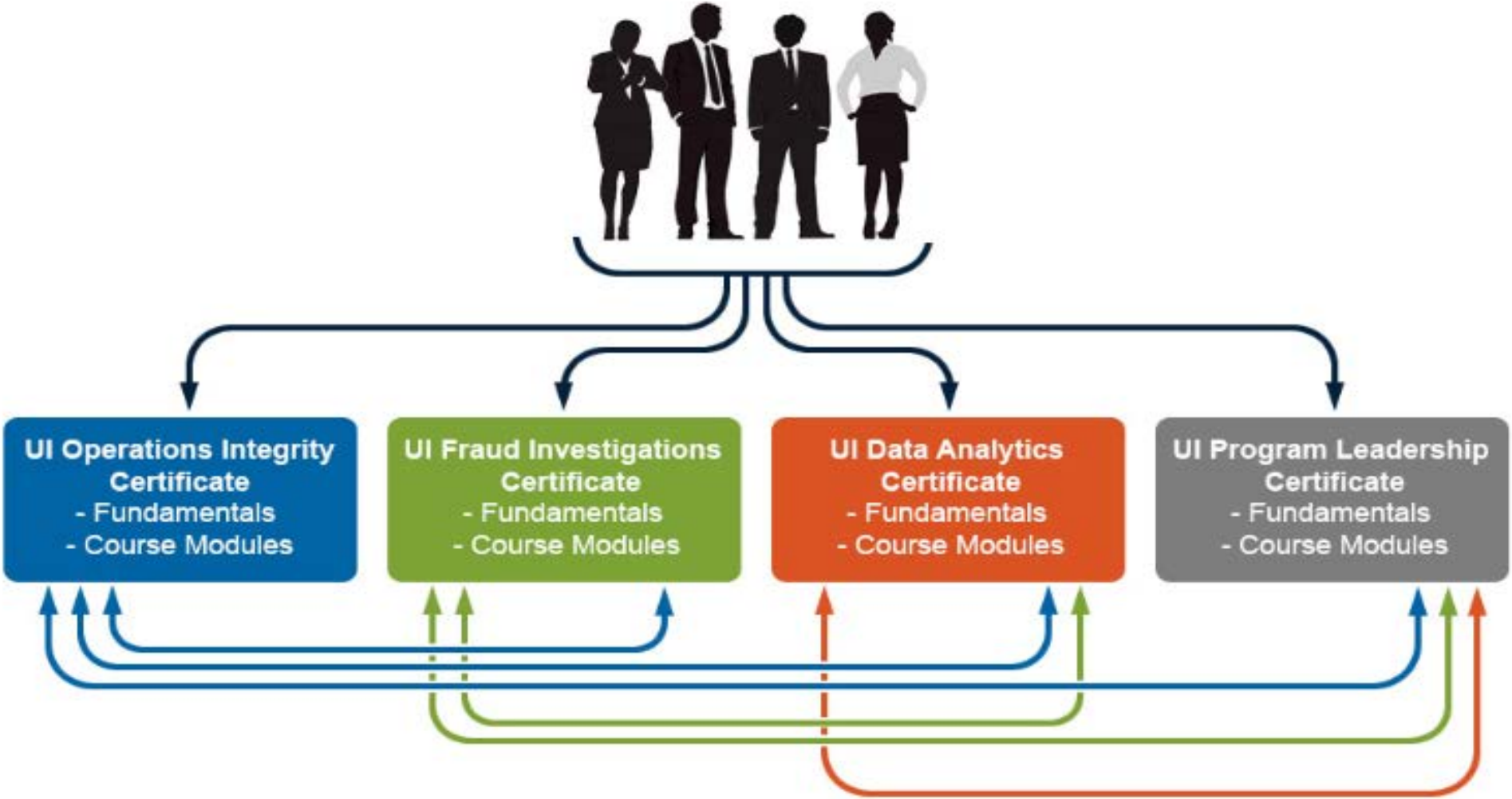
National Integrity Training Academy

STRATEGY: Develop a series of stackable certificates that provide multiple career pathway options for state UI staff.

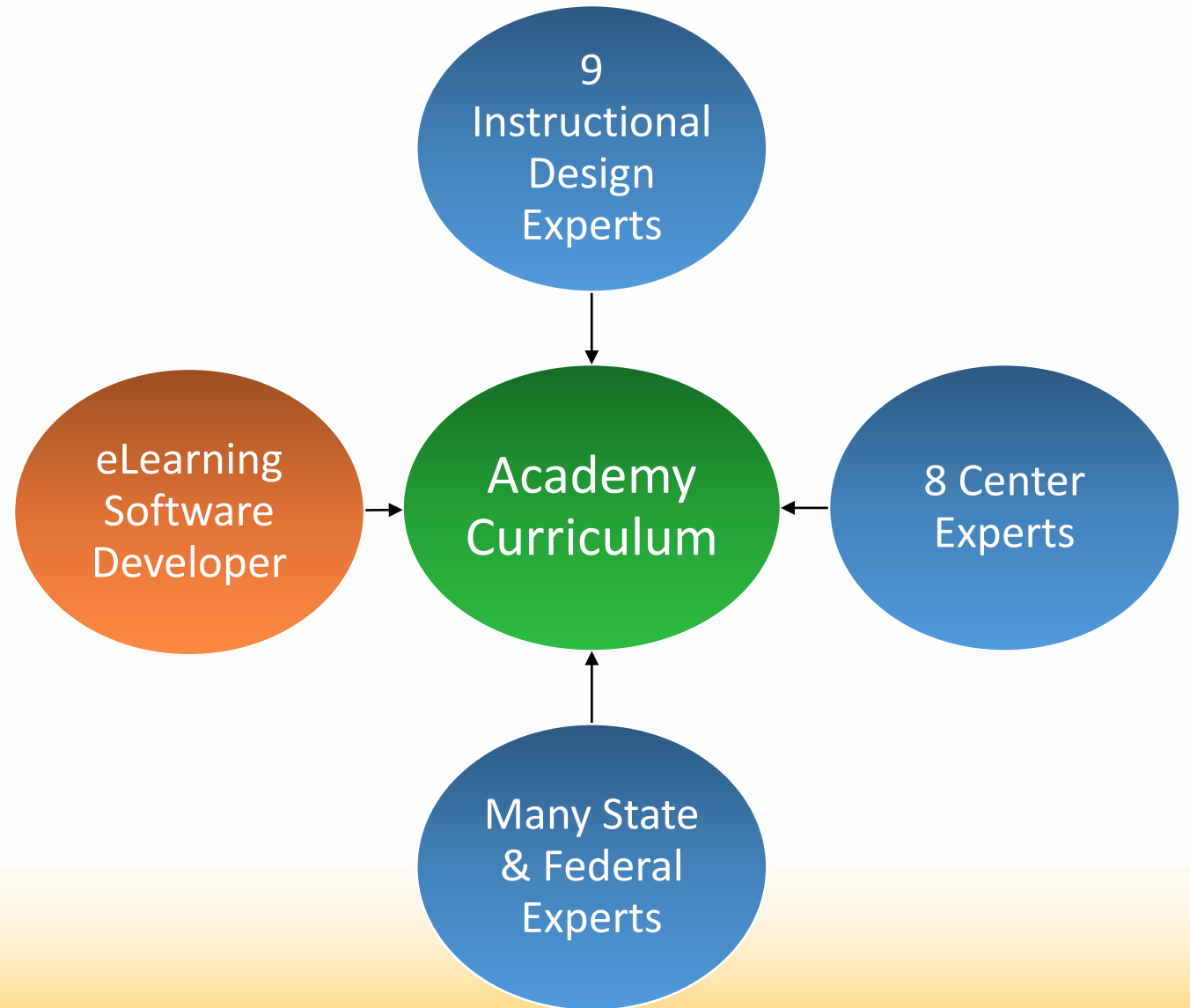

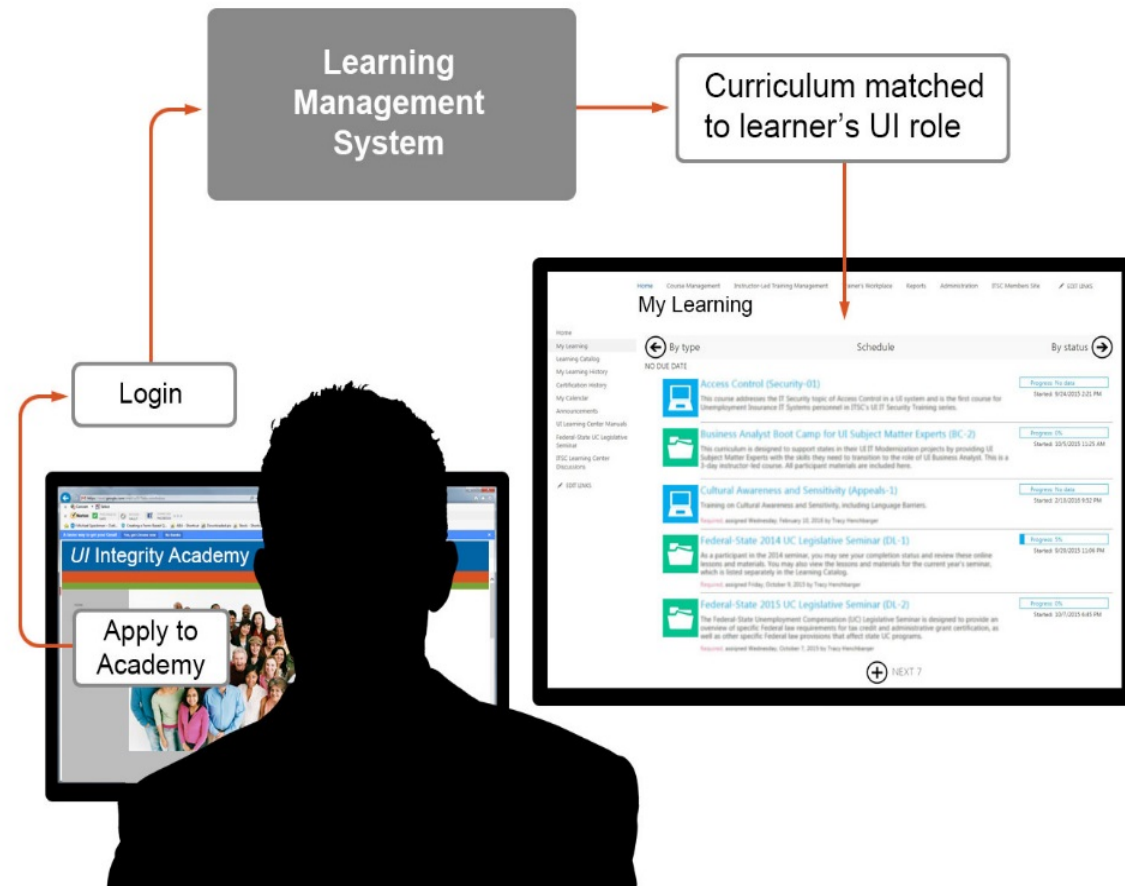
